Jessica's nominator shared that when meeting Jessica for the first time as an applicant for a clinical research coordinator role, her uniqueness was immediately clear. A rich tapestry of diverse experiences painted her background—from marketing and communications to

her invaluable time as an Emergency Medical Technician in San Francisco. Her pivot towards public health, marked by a deep dive into Health Policy and Management at UC Berkeley, broad-

Becky joined UCSF in the 1990s as a dietitian, transitioning to clinical study coordinator and later becoming SCOPE clinical project director. In 2019, she became vice chair for the Research Unit

Design Group, significantly influencing the new Community and Clinical Research Center (CCRC) in Pride Hall. During the Covid-19 pandemic, her team initiated the LIINC study, a pioneering longitudinal cohort on Covid-19. Recognized for her outstanding service,

Her leadership in the LIINC program led to several collaborations, clinical trials, and over \$20 million in NIH and foundation funding.
