John Murray, MD Award for Excellence in Internal Medicine

This award is presented to a Medicine faculty member in recognition of academic excellence and dedication to the humanitarian mission of ZSFG.

Mary Gray, MD Cardiology

Dr. Mary Gray exemplifies the highest standards of academic excellence and humanitarian service at ZSFG. As a distinguished cardiologist, she provides outstanding care across multiple settings - from the Cardiac Care Unit to the ECHO lab and outpatient clinics. Her clinical expertise is matched by her extraordinary commitment to teaching and mentoring the next generation of physicians.

Colleagues consistently praise Dr. Gray's remarkable availability and thoughtful guidance. She is known for not only providing timely advice but also following up to ensure positive outcomes. As a physician leader in risk management, she has made significant

contributions to patient safety and quality improvement across the campus.

Lurit Bepo, MD Hospital Medicine

Dr. Lurit Bepo exemplifies the highest standards of patient-centered care through her unique combination of internal medicine and addiction medicine expertise. Her warm, compassionate approach, coupled with clinical excellence, has made her an outstanding addition to ZSFG's mission of providing exceptional care to all patients.



Despite being early in her career, Dr. Bepo has demonstrated remarkable initiative and versatility. She has provided extensive clinical service across multiple settings, including

the Resident Inpatient Service (RIS), Faculty Inpatient Service (FIS), and Richard Fine People's Clinic (RFPC). Most notably, she identified a crucial gap in patient care and responded by founding an ambulatory procedures clinic, improving access to essential medical procedures for our vulnerable patient population.

Dr. Bepo's commitment to excellence extends beyond direct patient care through her leadership of SFPC resident journal clubs, contributing to both medical education and evidence-based practice. Her "can-do" energy and dedication to respectful, comprehensive patient care make her a worthy recipient of the Care Experience Award.

Clinical Innovator Award

Known for her kind and gracious demeanor, Dr. Ochoa-Frongia creates a supportive learning environment that puts trainees at ease while challenging them to grow professionally. Her dedication to medical education has significantly enhanced residents' ability to provide comprehensive care to our diverse patient population.

Henry F. Chambers, MD Medicine Subspecialty Consultant Award

throughout the hospital. This innovative program demonstrates Dr. Moody's commitment to both patient care and staff support, ensuring that palliative services are readily accessible across all hospital units.

ZSFG Performance/Quality Improvement Award

address critical questions in the field. Her versatile approach to research, combined with her talent for coalition building, has established her as a go-to expert in addiction medicine nationally.
